Serge up this quick and easy one-day reversible quilt project using an assortment of fabrics, decorative thread and the flatlock stitch on the serger. It will make that special someone a perfect gift. Check page two for an optional tote information.

You will receive a 20% discount on supplies needed for class. Please ask for assistance.

You Will Need-*Please thoroughly read the supply list.*
Approximately 44" x 44"—can be made larger.

- Serger, electric cord, foot control and in good running order
- Regular serger foot, tweezers and tools that come with the serger
- Cloth Guide (if applicable)
- New Size 90/14 needles
- 1-spool of 12 weight Sulky cotton thread to coordinate with fabrics (if making larger, buy two)
- 2-cones serger thread to match 12 wt. Sulky cotton thread above
- Spray Adhesive (ex. KK100 or 505)—need for before class preparation, see below.
- Rotary Cutter—a must
- 6" x 24" Ruler—a must
- Scissors
- Ripper
- Pins
- Babylock Owners – Bring Reference Guide



Fabric Needed

- ½ yd of nine to twelve different fabrics (The more different fabrics the better)
- 1/2-5/8 yd of fabric for binding to coordinate with fabrics
- 2 ½ yd of Pellon Fleece (**available at ASM**)—**a must** (3 yds if using 12 different fabrics)
NOTE: Other types of batting cannot be used.
- Bring scrap fabric sandwich pieces for test stitching

Before Class Preparation

1. Cut Pellon Fleece into 18" x 22" pieces (nine or twelve)
2. Lay ½ yd of fabric on cutting table with the fold facing you. Open up fabric and spray wrong side of bottom half with spray adhesive. Lay 18" x 22" pellon fleece over fabric and spray with spray adhesive again. Fold over the other half of fabric on top of the pellon fleece and smooth out.
3. Cut 4" strips of quilt sandwich, yield 4-5 strips (cut parallel with selvedge, or cut edge to cut edge) When all 4" strips have been cut from the half yard, then turn and cut into 8" segments, should yield 8-10 rectangles that measure 4" x 8" from each fabric. 72 - 82 rectangles will be needed, bring extra to help with layout.
4. Repeat for the remaining ½ yds of fabric.
5. From the binding fabric, cut six 3 ½" strips

Serger Setup

- Three-thread Wide Flatlock stitch
Place 12 wt. Sulky cotton thread in the upper looper, serger thread in the left needle and lower looper.
- Differential feed 1.0 or Normal
- Stitch Length 2.0

OPTION

If you want to make a tote instead, you will need 36 – 42 rectangles. This will create a large enough tote with boxed bottoms. Repeat the steps 1-4 under Before Class Preparation.
